Every father has three distinctive roles to maintain: provider, maintainer, and instructor.


3. A Father's Relationships (Proverbs 5:15-19; 15:20)

Fathers have the opportunity for vibrant relationships in their home—with their wives and with their children.




As you seek to pursue godly character in being a father, *embrace your role* and *encourage your relationships*.


